Anzac Day 2024

Our second Dawn Service was a lovely success with a tiny drizzle of rain easing during the Service which was attended by Councillor Nick Cole representing the Corangamite Shire Council and over 70 people, plus Troubles, the local horse. Candles along the back wall and a small fire pit in the front of the Cenotaph added to the atmosphere needed for such a special day remembering our war heroes of the past and present.

Breakfast of bacon & eggs in bread with coffee & tea was offered to all who attended.

At the 11am Service, CpI Gary Byers led the Catafalque Party from the 8/7 Infantry Battalion and the Skipton School Children led the March down the main street to the Cenotaph in Anderson Street. The fire pit was lit for the Service and with many beautiful floral wreaths, readings from each of the grade five and six Skipton Primary School Students and the Ode read by the Beaufort Secondary High School Students – another Memorial to remember on Anzac Day.

A Pyrenees Advocate article written in 1995 about – Sgt John Fletcher, on Active Service – was read with deep emotion by Trudy Boyer, John's Granddaughter whilst Malcolm Fletcher, John's son, looked on.

The Corangamite Council was instrumental in providing us with a 2nd Flag Pole for the New Zealand Flag which we proudly raised in Skipton for the first time along with our Australian Flag as the Reveille is played.

Rain came down as we finished our 11 am Service and we proceeded to the Mechanics Hall for a display shown by the Skipton Historical Society of our War Memories and a warm delicious lunch.

A very special thanks to Country Grocers, Ballarat Officeworks who, along with many volunteers, provided enormous support in logistics and catering.





When the Australian forces landed on Tarakan in Borneo on May 1. 1945, Sergeant John Campbell Fletcher was in charge of an Tank Attack Platoon.

On June 5, Sergeant Fletcher moved his platoon forward to occupy enemy forward defence positions on Charity-Vessie Ridge, moving himself behind the two forward scouts. When the scouts came under observation from the first enemy bunker, he ordered the forward section around the right flank covering them with his Owen sub-machine gun. then rushed the position. finding it clear of the enemy.

Noticing a further occupied bunker, he ordered his men to the right and ed at Tobruk when left of the bunker. Then, under the cover of their fire, he rushed the enemy bunker and threw his grenades. He moved to the bunker's entrance firing his machine gun until it ran out of ammunition. When a Japanese soldier grabbed his gun, John overpowered him.

Calling for covering fire. Sergeant Fletcher ran back for more grenades, and although in great pain from a wound he sustained as he charged the bunker, he then threw

another grenade into the bunker, killing the three Japanese who were occupying the position, enabling the platoon to advance.

For this action he was awarded the Military Medal for Bravery.

John Fletcher, who was the second son of John and Christina Fletcher. was born at Naracoorte on October 21, 1917

He began his working life droving in southern New South Wales and when war was declared. he enlisted in the 2nd 24th 26th Anti Tank Regiment. He saw action in the Middle East, Tobruk, Palestine, Svria. Alamein and nearer home in New Guinea and Borneo.

John was also wound-Rommel's attempt to storm the city was defeated. The siege of Tobruk has became a legend.

After John's discharge from the Army on April 20, 1946, during which he had served for 635 days within Australia. and 1,110 days outside Australia, he married Thelma Scott and they lived at 'Nigretta', Hamilton. They then moved to Skipton where John worked with the Settlement Soldier Commission prior to selecting a Soldiers Settlement Block at Mt Emu. Here John and Thelma spent the rest of their married life, and reared their two children. Malcolm and Leonie.

John passed away on June 21, 1983, at the age of 65 years. He had been a member of Ararat Legacy for twenty-five vears; served as President

and Secretary of the Skipton RSL: he was an active member of the Fire Brigade, Lions Club and Beaufort and Skipton Football Clubs.

Obviously, John lived his life in his community with the same outstanding dedication and commitment that he had given during his military service.

FLU VACCINATIONS NOW AVAILABLE






